

IAAH World Congress 2021 – WORKSHOP SUBMISSION INFORMATION

Today's adolescents live in a world of unprecedented change that affects all aspects of their health, growth and development. The 12th World Congress on Adolescent Health will provide a unique opportunity to showcase research leading to sustainable actions for adolescent health and wellbeing.

Workshops provide a collaborative forum for groups of typically 20-50 participants to conduct intensive discussions on a particular topic, or facilitate skills- and capacity-building sessions in a specific area. They are intended as a forum for lively discussion on innovative ideas, recent progress, or practical experience on specific aspects, specific problems, or domain-specific needs. We encourage prospective workshop organizers to submit proposals for highly-interactive workshops. Both research-oriented and applied topics are welcome. Workshops can be accommodated for 60-minute, 90-minute, or 150-minute sessions.

- Relevance to the Congress thematic areas

- Balance and synergy between the proposed topics
- Continuity of workshop series
